

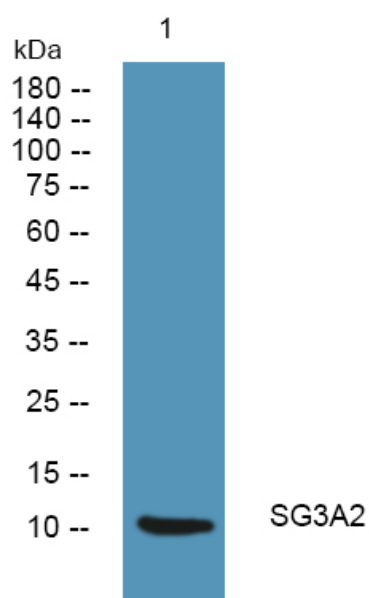

Cell Pathway	Secreted .
Tissue Specificity	Highly expressed in lung and trachea (PubMed:12406855, PubMed:12175512, PubMed:12847263). Detected throughout the airway epithelium in lung, with slightly higher expression in large airways (PubMed:12406855). Found in lung submucosal gland acinus where it localizes to serous-like cells (PubMed:12406855). Probably expressed in club/Clara cells of the bronchioles (PubMed:12847263). Not detected in other tissues tested (PubMed:12847263).
Function	similarity:Belongs to the secretoglobin family. UGRP subfamily.,subunit:Homodimer.,tissue specificity:Highly expressed in lung.,
Background	The protein encoded by this gene is a secreted lung surfactant protein and a downstream target of thyroid transcription factor. A single nucleotide polymorphism in the promoter of this gene results in susceptibility to asthma.[provided by RefSeq, Mar 2010],
matters needing attention	Avoid repeated freezing and thawing!
