Cell Pathway	Cytoplasm, cytoskeleton.
Tissue Specificity	Highly expressed in brain, skeletal muscle and kidney and less strongly in heart, placenta, lung and liver.
Function	function:Binds to actin and affects the structure of the cytoskeleton. At high concentrations, profilin prevents the polymerization of actin, whereas it enhances it at low concentrations. By binding to PIP2, it inhibits the formation of IP3 and DG.,similarity:Belongs to the profilin family.,subunit:Occurs in many kinds of cells as a complex with monomeric actin in a 1:1 ratio.,tissue specificity:Highly expressed in brain, skeletal muscle and kidney and less strongly in heart, placenta, lung and liver.,
Background	The protein encoded by this gene is a ubiquitous actin monomer-binding protein belonging to the profilin family. It is thought to regulate actin polymerization in response to extracellular signals. There are two alternatively spliced transcript variants encoding different isoforms described for this gene. 
